



### **Home Learning at Mount Primary**

Reading daily is the most important thing that we would like children to do at home. We want all of our children to develop fluency and a love of books therefore developing their vocabulary, knowledge of the world and cultural awareness.

<b>F2</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reading Oxford Owl book at least 4 times a week. These texts are 100% phonetically decodable so your child will have been taught all of the letter sounds to read these books.</li> <li>• Access the Oxford Owl elibrary via your child's login</li> <li>• Numbots- online number skills once a week</li> <li>• Phonics Play – online games to develop phonics skills once a week</li> <li>• Regular literacy and maths activities that will be shared on Class Dojo and can be completed practically.</li> </ul>
<b>KS1</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reading Oxford Owl book at least 4 times a week. These texts are 100% phonetically decodable so your child will have been taught all of the letter sounds to read these books.</li> <li>• Access the Oxford Owl elibrary via your child's login</li> <li>• Half termly maths activity sheet- you can send photographs on Dojo to your child's class teacher when they have completed an activity</li> <li>• Year 1- Numbots- online number skills once a week</li> <li>• Year 2- TTRS- once a week</li> <li>• Weekly spelling and handwriting- Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check</li> </ul>
<b>Y3/4</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Either a levelled or free-reader book depending on the child's fluency and comprehension levels to be read 4 times a week</li> <li>• Times Table Rockstars- keep practising these as much as possible to ensure the child can recall all timetables up to 12X12 by the end of Y4</li> <li>• Weekly spelling and handwriting- Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check</li> </ul>
<b>Y5/6</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Either levelled or free-reader book dependent on child's fluency and comprehension levels to be read at least 4 times a week.</li> <li>• Times Table Rockstars- keep practising these as much as possible to ensure the child can recall all timetables up to 12X12 by the end of Y4</li> <li>• Weekly spelling and handwriting- Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check</li> <li>• Y6- Reading/Maths questions</li> </ul>
